

Are allergy drops safe?

Allergy drops are safe for most people and are considered to be a “viable alternative” to allergy shots, according to the World Health Organization. In Europe and other parts of the world, the drops (sublingual immunotherapy) have been used for over six decades. During this time, there have been no reported cases of fatality as a result of this therapy.

To ensure each patient’s safety, our company adheres fully to the published consensus panel recommendations of the American Academy of Otolaryngic Allergy (AAOA).



What are the cost benefits?

Make allergy shots a thing of the past with allergy drops.

If you suffer from allergies, stop fighting the symptoms and begin living your life. Make allergy shots a thing of the past with allergy drops.

Typically in the United States, immunotherapy has been given weekly as a shot or injection in the doctor's office. Using allergy drops once daily under the tongue (sublingual) at home has been proven to be safe and effective for many patients. It has been used for over 60 years in Europe. It is also called sublingual immunotherapy, or SLIT.

Allergy drops may benefit every sufferer, no matter their age or type of allergy. Due to the fact that allergy drops are painless, portable, and self-administered, virtually anyone who is unable to receive allergy shots may be able to use drops to ease their allergies.

Those who may benefit from allergy drops are:

- Children and adults
- Asthma and allergic rhinitis sufferers
- Needle-phobic people
- People with numerous allergies, including mold allergies
- People who are not able to commit to weekly allergy shots
- People with an intolerance to the side-effects of medications

Allergy drops are:

Safe and Effective: Allergy drops are safe and effective for most people. The drops usually begin working within months, often after only a few weeks, and may eliminate allergies within three years.

Other conditions like allergic rhinitis and asthma, that may go hand-in-hand with allergies, may be alleviated as well.

Convenient: Allergy drops are portable and easy to use. Whether at home, at work, on vacation, or even in the car; the patient dispenses the drops instead of taking time out of his/her busy schedule to get an allergy shot. After starting allergy drops, many allergy sufferers discover they may need less symptom-relieving medication.

Painless: Avoid the painful plunge of the needle and the aching pressure after the injection. For many, the fear of getting a shot borders on a serious phobia. Allergy drops may mean the end of avoiding medical care because of a fear of needles and the pain they cause.

Less Expensive: Allergy shots are painful not only to the body, but to the pocketbook as well. Allergy drops are generally less expensive for everyone: patients, employers, and insurers. The cost of weekly visits to the doctor for shots may be eliminated, and loss of workdays because of incapacitating allergy attacks may also be avoided.



"I want to use allergy drops. How do I start?"

1. Consultation:

Your doctor will most likely ask you questions regarding your previous history with allergies, as well as gathering information about your current environment. Many times, allergies may be avoided by changing your lifestyle and/or environment.

2. Testing:

Your doctor will test you for allergies, either by conducting a skin or blood test. Once the results are reviewed by your doctor, he/she is able to determine your allergies. At this time, your doctor will be able to determine if you need a pre-seasonal allergy regimen or a longer course of treatment.



3. Prescription:

Your doctor will complete a prescription form to be sent to Embrace Pharmacy, a Division of All-American Allergy Alternatives, LLC. A customized prescription of allergy drops will be prepared by a pharmacist based on the results of your skin or blood test. Your doctor may also prescribe medications such as antihistamines and nasal sprays in order to reduce the allergy symptoms you may be feeling. Often the need for these medications will decrease over time due to allergy drops.

4. Demonstration and Education:

Your doctor will most likely want to see you in his/her office in order to demonstrate the use of allergy drops and to provide education regarding the self-administration of your drops. It is important to be comfortable with the process of administering the drops. Your doctor will generally want to schedule a follow-up appointment in three to six months.
